SAUDI DISCOVERS NATURAL GAS

bin Salman revealed the identification of

two new gas fields in the Eastern Province and the Empty Quarter. As per the Ministry of Energy's statement, the initial find occurred at the Al-Hiran-1 well in the Hanifa reservoir, with a gas flow of 30 million standard cubic feet per day, accompanied by 1,600 barrels of condensate. Simultaneously, the Arab-C reservoir in the same field yielded a gas flow of 3.1 million scf per day. The second discovery took place at the Al-Mahakek-2 well, registering a natural gas flow of 0.85 million scf per day.

Additionally, five other reservoirs in previously identified fields showcased natural gas discoveries. The Jalla reservoir in the Assekra field exhibited a gas flow of 46 million scf per day. The Unaizah-A reservoir in the Shadoun field witnessed a daily natural gas flow of 15.5 million scf, while the Unaizah B/ C reservoir in the Mazalij field in southwest Dhahran produced gas at a rate of a million scf per day. The Al-Sara field and Al-Wadihi field also unveiled reservoirs with natural gas flows of 11.7 million and 5.1 million scf per day, respectively.

The unveiling of these natural gas reservoirs aligns with Aramco's strategic plan to augment gas production by more than 50 percent from 2021 levels, with the aim of satisfying domestic demand by 2030. Earlier in the month, Saudi Aramco initiated the production of unconventional tight gas in its South Ghawar operational area, surpassing its schedule by two months.



Unconventional tight gas, or shale gas, is typically found in reserves where hydrocarbons are tightly trapped within rock layers, necessitating specialised techniques such as horizontal drilling and hydraulic fracturing.

The facilities at South Ghawar currently have a processing capa city of 300 million standard cubic feet per day for raw gas and 38,000 barrels per day for condensate.
