He believed that married men made weak soldiers since they gave priority to their families and most of the married soldiers were reluctant to leave their families for battle. Hence Claudius abolished the concept of marriage. Therefore Bishop Valentine took it upon himself to get the soldiers married. He used to secretly invite lovers to his place and conduct their marriages. When Emperor Claudius found out about this he was furious and had Valentine arrested.



According to a source while in jail and awaiting execution, Valentine fell in love with the blind daughter of the jailer. Before his execution Valentine sent her a message signed "From Your Valentine". Until today, this phrase is used worldwide on Valentine's Day.

The Rise in of the Valentine's Day Card began in the United States in 1850's, by

Esther Howland, a wealthy stationers d a u g h t e r f r o m W o r c e s t o r, Massachusetts. She founded one of the first factories for mass-produced Valentine's Day cards in the United States. The first Valentine cards were rectangular in shape, made of fancy lace, and frequently depicted poems, cherubs, heart motifs, birds, flowers, and other symbols still used to mark the occasion today.



At the same time, there was pushback in popular literature against buying these Valentine's cards. It was thought a husband spending his hard-earned cash on something as trivial as a fancy paper card was not a good sign for the marital ahead. The holidav road continued to evolve from the 19th century on, becoming more of а technological and marketing story. Just Chromolithography. This like is a multicolour method for making prints, which made the massproduction of Valentine's Day cards even easier.

Today, most people exchange gifts on Valentine's Day, and we see shades of pink, flowers, chocolates, romantic movies, wine and images of a magical baby boy who flies around shooting arrows at people. So who is Cupid?

The first heart-shaped box of chocolates was introduced in 1861. It was created by Richard Cadbury, son of Cadbury founder John Cadbury, who started packaging chocolates in fancy boxes to increase sales. He introduced the first heart-shaped box of chocolates for V-Day in 1861.



Today, more than 36 million heartshaped boxes of chocolates are sold each year.



Then in 1866 sweets had printed messages on conversation hearts. More than 8 billion conversation hearts are now manufactured each year.

The holiday, is celebrated on February 13, was introduced by Amy Poehler's Parks and Recreation character Leslie Knope in 2010.
