Perfect front row seats to London's skyline enjoy a beautiful tasting menu featuring seasonal dishes paired with fine wines and a live band.



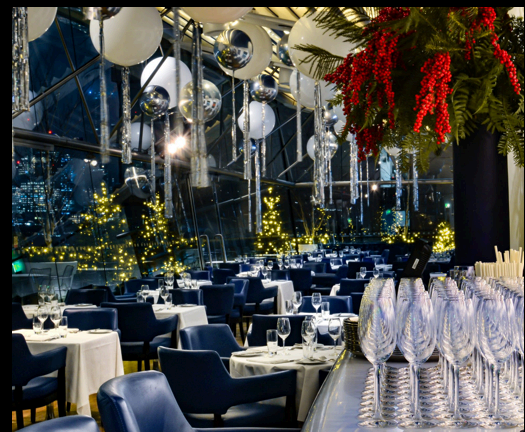

For one night a year the OXO Tower Restaurant, Bar and Brasserie receives its most substantial makeover of the year, for the biggest celebration of the year.



Thousands of people gathered in central London for the annual New Year's Day parade. It is a street parade which first launched in 1987 under the name Lord Mayor of Westminster's Big Parade but was renamed in 1994. It was temporarily called the Millennium Parade. More than 8,000 performers from 20 nations took part in the procession through central London



The street parade was forced to become a virtual event in 2021. Last year due to Covid-19 pandemic restriction only 600 ticket holders attended a pared back production in a temporary outdoor arena.



This year the three-hour parade took place in the heart of London, a selection of colours covering well known areas including Regent Street and Trafalgar Square. The LNYDP featured marching bands, representatives from all 32 London boroughs, musical groups, and a town crier also took part in the parade.



The parade lasted 3 hours, it took place in the heart of London, covering locations as Regents Street and Trafalgar Square.

The route begins at Piccadilly, right outside the famous Ritz hotel. It then heads east to Piccadilly Circus, before moving south down Regent Street St James's. Then down Pall Mall, past Trafalgar Square, and along Whitehall to the finish point at Westminster.

This was a great way of supporting the London tourism sector too as people from around the world traveled to take part in the event.

The city of London is vibrant and transforms as Christmas approaches. With so much to do and see, we sure made it our missions to attend 'The Fabulous World of Dior' exhibition in Harrods.

Dior had created an impressive presentation illuminating the halls of the iconic department store.



44 of Harrods' iconic window displays, were presented with iconic Dior pieces including beauty, fashion and homeware in a gingerbread house themed display.

Apart from the exhibition there was a gingerbread themed Dior Cafe. Filled with objects and decor inspired by Christmas fairytales and stories, it was a truly magical experience for all.



The name 'The Fabulous World of Dior' is in part a celebration of house founder Christian Dior's own love for Christmas. The takeover featured delicate creations in gingerbread of a festive village, providing transporting stories.
