## UK WILL HOST GLOBAL SUMMIT ON AI SAFETY

According to the UK government, there will be a global summit held on artificial intelligence safety in the UK later this year. The Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and U.S. President Joe Biden engaged in discussions concerning this technology earlier this month. The British government stated that the summit will address the potential risks associated with artificial intelligence, including frontier systems. The discussions will focus on finding ways to mitigate these risks through internationally coordinated actions.



The summit, which will take place in the autumn, will bring together tech companies and various countries. Additionally, it will serve as a platform for nations to collaborate in advancing a collective strategy aimed at minimising these risks.

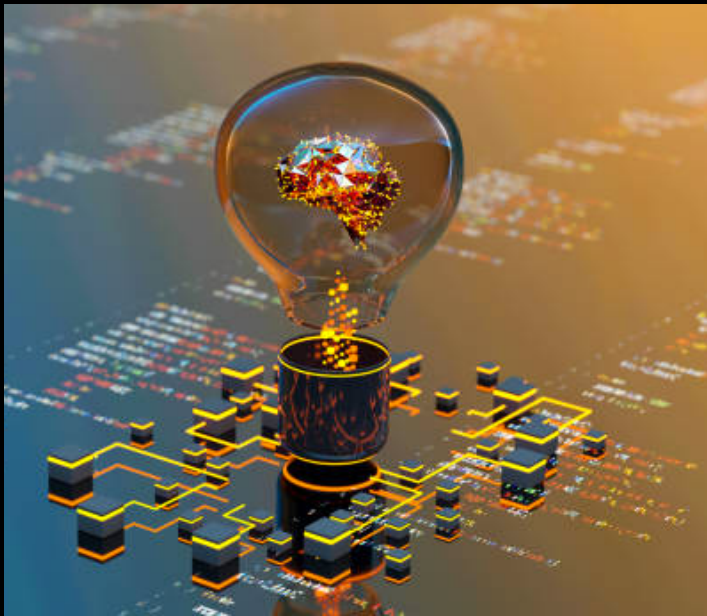
The UK asserts its favourable position to initiate discussions regarding the future of AI, emphasising that its AI industry already makes a significant £3.7 billion contribution to the country's economy and provides employment opportunities for 50,000 individuals nationwide.

In light of OpenAI's ChatGPT release, numerous governments are currently contemplating strategies to address the potential hazards associated with this emerging technology. Given its surge in investment and consumer popularity in recent months, there is an increased focus on mitigating these risks.

U.S. technology company Palantir Technologies, which already has more than 800 employees in Britain, will separately announce plans to make the UK its new European headquarters for AI development, the British government said. Due to its strong connections with the military and defence sectors, there are concerns about the potential misuse of AI technology.

While the list of participants for the forthcoming summit has yet to be disclosed, the UK government intends to assemble prominent nations, major technology companies, and researchers with the aim of establishing safety protocols for artificial intelligence (AI).



In the past year, the rapid advancements in machine learning has raised concerns about the need for sufficient government regulation.

These concerns have been further accentuated by AI experts drawing parallels between the potential risks associated with AI and those of pandemics or nuclear weapons. The term "AI" has also gained significant attention in the business world.

During a recent address to shareholders, Andy Jassy, the CEO of Amazon, expressed the company's anticipation of becoming the next frontrunner in generative AI. Regarding generative AI, the company plans to allow users to create artwork specifically designed for television using this technology.

AI events provide excellent opportunities for networking and acquiring knowledge in the field of artificial intelligence. With the future of AI being incredibly promising and its development progressing rapidly, one can expect a continuous stream of new announcements and technologies throughout 2023 without any signs of slowing down.

## APPLE LAUNCHES NEW PRODUCT - APPLE VISION PRO

In other tech related news, Apple has made an announcement regarding the introduction of an augmented reality headset known as Apple Vision Pro. This innovative device aims to seamlessly integrate the real world with digital elements, offering users a cohesive experience.



During WWDC23, Apple provided a preview of the Vision Pro, positioning it as their inaugural spatial computer. Although the mixed-reality headset showcases impressive advancements, there are apprehensions regarding Apple's vision for its functionality. Despite the product's release being several months away, there is a growing sense of unease surrounding it. Apple's emphasis on social features during the keynote has contributed to concerns about the potential for further disconnection among individuals through the use of the Vision Pro.

The Apple Vision Pro, designed in the likeness of ski goggles, features a glass screen with an impressive resolution of 23 million pixels. This screen covers the upper portion of the wearer's face and can be controlled through eye movements, hand gestures, and voice commands. Retailing at \$3,500.



The display and computing component of the Apple Vision Pro bears resemblance to the design elements seen in the Apple Watch. It features an aluminium housing, a curved laminated glass component that exhibits a more pronounced curve, and even includes a digital crown located on the top right side of the unit, serving as a physical user interface.

## TROOPING THE COLOUR 2023

On Saturday, Britain commemorated the official birthday of King Charles III with a grand military parade known as Trooping the Colour. This marked his first official birthday celebration as the sovereign. The event featured a spectacle of 1,400 soldiers, 400 musicians, and the remarkable presence of 200 horses. Thousands gathered to witness King Charles's inaugural Trooping the Colour as the reigning monarch. This Birthday Parade held special significance as it marked the first occasion in over 30 years that a sitting monarch rode in on horseback as part of the event



Accompanying King Charles III on horseback as the parade made its way through the Mall to Buckingham Palace in central London were his son and heir, William, who holds the title of the Prince of Wales, as well as his sister Anne, known as the Princess Royal, and his brother Edward, who carries the title of the Duke of Edinburgh.

Following the Trooping the Colour ceremony, the King was treated to an elaborate military flypast as part of his Coronation day celebration. Unfortunately, due to inclement weather, the original display was scaled down. Nevertheless, approximately 70 aircraft from the Royal Navy, British Army, and Royal Air Force, including some historic planes from the Battle of Britain memorial flight, participating in the event.



The King, Queen, and other members of the Royal family observed the flypast from the balcony of Buckingham Palace as the aircraft flew over The Mall, creating a captivating six-minute spectacle.
